

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
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**IMPORTANT:** All baseplates **must** be assembled with all the bolts left loose for final adjustment and positioning (before tightening) unless otherwise instructed. All bolts **must** be torqued for proper strength. If more than one bolt is used per fastening point, the diagram may only show one. Use flat washers over all slotted holes and lock washers on all fasteners.



Failure to heed these warnings or follow the installation instructions may result in a voided warranty, loss of towed vehicle, personal injury or death.

- Do not weld or modify this baseplate or its components. Welding or modification will void the warranty.
- Do not use this document as a basis to design/fabricate a baseplate, as it may not show all parts or structural components.
- We strongly recommend professional installation.
- If the towed vehicle has been in an accident, it must be properly repaired before attaching the baseplate. Do not install the baseplate if any structural frame damage is found.
- The installer must use all bolts and parts supplied. If running changes were made by the vehicle manufacturer after this kit was designed, some bolts or other fasteners may no longer be the correct size. It is the installer's responsibility to verify this kit is securely fastened to the vehicle.
- Use Loctite® Red on all bolts used to secure this baseplate. Torque all bolts to the specifications found at the end of these instructions. Do not over-torque the bolts or failure may occur.
- The installer must inspect the baseplate to ensure adequate clearance, particularly around hoses, air conditioner lines, radiators, etc. or non-warranty failure may result.
- Roadmaster manufactures many styles of baseplates. If your baseplate has removable arms, they must be removed before driving the vehicle, unless the arms can be pinned or padlocked in place. If not secured, the arms could vibrate out.
- Some motorhome chassis have such a tight turning radius that you
  can damage your motorhome, towed vehicle, tow bar or baseplate
  while turning sharply. Before getting on the road, test your turning radius in an empty parking lot. Turning too sharply could

- result in non-warranty damage to your towing system, motorhome and/or towed vehicle.
- Do not back up with the towed vehicle attached or non-warranty damage will occur to your towing system or vehicles.
- The safety cables must connect the towing vehicle to the towed vehicle frame to frame, with the cables crossed, with enough slack for sharp turns. See cable instructions for proper routing. Failure to do so will result in non-warranty damage and/or the loss of the towed vehicle.
- This kit is designed for use with ROADMASTER tow bars and ROADMASTER adapters only. Using this kit with other brands, without an approved ROADMASTER adapter, may result in nonwarranty damage or injury.
- Receiver extensions and out-of-level towing situations of 3 inches or more. This can cause the system to swing much higher and lower, causing excessive strain on the tow bar, baseplate and frame. That can cause the towing system to fail, causing property damage, personal injury or even death. If you must use a receiver extension or drop hitch to tow, it will reduce your receiver's weight capacity by 1/3 to avoid damaging your system. Never use more than one extension and/or drop hitch, as this will void your warranty.
- Every 3,000 miles, the owner must inspect all mounting points for cracks or fatigue, and check the fasteners for proper torque, according to the bolt torque requirements chart on the last page of these instructions.
- The owner must follow the vehicle manufacturer's instructions to prepare the vehicle for towing. Failure to do so may cause severe damage to the vehicle.
- This baseplate is only warranteed for the original installation.
   Installing a used baseplate on another vehicle is not recommended and will void the warranty.



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his bracket kit is one of our XL series, which allows the bracket arms to be easily removed from the front of the vehicle.

The kit consists of two receiver braces, front braces, lower cable plates and a hardware pack. The main braces mount below the front bumper facia to the front frame tubes and take the place of the existing tow loops (Fig.A).

Start by laying the kit out according to the illustration. This will give you a visual idea of how the kit installs and also confirm that the kit components are present and accounted for.











- 1. *Important:* please use all supplied bolts and parts and read all instructions carefully before beginning this installation. The majority of questions you may have can be answered within the text, and proper installation will ensure safe and secure travel. Now, begin the installation. To gain access to the top bumper mounting bolts remove the small lower front grille by pulling forward sharply, then removing two top caps in the bumper (Fig.B,C).
- 2. Locate and remove two top bumper- mounting bolts, located in the two access holes in the top of the bumper (Fig.D,E). Now remove two lower mounting bolts and set the bumper aside (Fig.F,G).













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
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- 4. Insert the braces as shown into the front of the frame tubes, then bolt through the rear mounting hole, the frame, backing plates and 1.0625" spacers with a ½" x5" bolt, flat washer, lock washer and nut on each side (Fig.I). Put the front bolt in the existing hole on the inside of the frame tube to align the brace then tighten the rear bolt to hold the side plate and brace in alignment (Fig.J).
- 5. Using the backing plate as a drill template drill through the outside of the frame with a 17/32" drill bit. Do this on each brace (Fig.K).







- 6. Bolt through the braces with this additional front bolt align the braces with each other then tighten to hold the position (Fig.L).
- 7. Now we have to drill through both sides of the frame to bolt through the lower mounting spacer. Measure 1 1/8" from the bottom of the frame and  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " forward of the frame gusset (Fig.M,N). Mark a hole center, then drill through the frame and brace.
- 8. Bolt through the braces with  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" bolts, flat washers, lock washers and nuts then torque all mounting bolts to the torque specifications below (Fig.O).
- 9. Reinstall the front bumper and grille reversing steps 1 and 2 with the exception of the two bottom bumper bolts. Find the lower safety cable plates (Item 4 on the hardware list) and bolt these plates to the bottom of the bumper using the existing bumper bolts (Fig.P).
- 10. Install the front braces and pin with 5/8" draw pins and 3/16" spring pins (Fig.O).
- 11. Install the front braces and secure with 5/8" draw pins and 3/16" spring pins.
- 12. Install the tow bar according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- 13. Attach the included safety cables to the safety cable mounting plates with the included cable connectors. Attach the tow vehicle's cables to the included safety cables and the tow bar.
